

#### Women's Bible Study—Spring Semester Registration

It's time to register for the Spring 2020 semester of WBS—*Fixing Our Eyes on Jesus:* A Study of the Book of Hebrews. The semester will begin on Wednesday, January 15 at 9:30am and 7pm, Friday, January 17 at 6am, and Sunday, January 19 at 9am. We'll kick things off with a recap of Hebrews 1—7:10, so if you missed the Fall semester, don't worry. We'll help you catch up, then we'll study the rest of the book together. Several months ago Pastor Mark Moser pointed out that research has shown that the most important single factor in personal spiritual growth is serious engagement with the Bible. Of course that can happen by listening to sermons and going to Bible studies. But there also needs to be a commitment to read the Bible for ourselves. Steve Smallman has compiled two possibilities to get started. One is a 15-week plan (basically from Christmas to Easter). There are 75 readings from the four Gospels and Acts that introduce the life and mission of Jesus. The readings are brief enough to be read in a family setting, or as a couple. The second is a two-year plan that will take you through the entire Bible once and the New Testament twice. It begins by reading a chapter of Proverbs every day in January--which is a great way to begin the new year. Copies of these plans can be found in various locations throughout the church building. We will be happy to mail you copies if you aren't local, or will be away. God has spoken--let us hear his Word!
