THE CONCEPT

The most basic truth of discipleship is that we are called to follow Jesus. But we can believe in him and follow him without knowing much about him. So the Lord anointed four authors to each write a <u>Gospel</u>--four accounts of Jesus' life and teachings to explain who he was and what it meant to follow him. The readings have been selected from the Gospels according to an outline that divides the adult life of Jesus into three years of ministry. Each year was marked by events in the life of John the Baptist.

- Year One Inauguration, started when John baptized Jesus in the Jordan River
- Year Two Popularity, started when John was put into prison
- Year Three Opposition, started with the report of John's death

THE PLAN

We have selected five readings for 15 weeks (75 readings) that will basically take you from the start of the New Year to Easter, but it can be read at any time, taking as long as you need. A longer portion has been selected for personal reading, but we often suggest a briefer reading (in parenthesis) for those who would like to use this for family worship and teaching that includes younger children. Regularly consulting a map of Palestine in the time of Jesus will make the readings much more meaningful. We suggest putting a check after each reading when you complete it and staying with the readings even if you get behind. Later you should go back and read through the entire New Testament, but this is a way to start meeting Jesus. If you need a modern language version of the Bible, we will be happy to provide you with one.
