In the Age of Kings, Prophets are Needed

The Story of Israel, Episode 8 of 10 1 Kings 21

The story of Israel is (true) history, it is sacred history, and it is our family history. We are telling this story in ten episodes: Promise, Salvation, Law, Land, Covenant, Temple, Division, **Prophets**, Exile, and Restoration. Today is episode #8, as the role of prophets grows.

Why prophets?

• See Deuteronomy 5 and 18.

But what *is* a prophet?

• More than someone who foretells the future... Instead a prophet is a human who *delivers a message from God*.

Series review

What do Israel's prophets have to do with Israel's kings?

- Kings had immense responsibilities and dangers. So God sent prophets to *encourage* kings.
- Kings had immense power and temptations. So God sent prophets to *confront* kings.

An example: Elijah confronts Ahab (1 Kings 21)

- Ahab covets a vineyard, and his wife Jezebel frames a man to acquire it (24:1-16)
 - o But the king is not above God's law...
- Elijah receives the message from God that he is to deliver (24:17-19)

- Ahab's hatred for the Lord's prophet is made clear (24:20)
 - Being a prophet is dangerous business! (See Acts 7:52, Luke 13:33)
- Elijah delivers the message (24:21-24)
- Ahab's surprising response: repentance (24:25-29)

Jesus: He's not just The King, He's also The Prophet (Acts 3:22)

• He comes to both encourage and confront... but will we listen?

Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Kings had immense responsibilities and dangers, and kings also had immense powers and temptations." List some of each of these.
 - a. How about you? You are not a king in the traditional sense, but do you have important responsibilities, dangers, powers, and temptations?
- 2. Read the account of Elijah confronting Ahab and Jezebel in 1 Kings 21.
 - a. Name a couple of things we can learn about a prophet from this passage.
- 3. It was God's grace to send His Word through prophets to Israel's kings, to encourage and confront. Now God has sent *the* (messianic) Prophet, Jesus, to both encourage and confront us.
 - a. List some of Jesus' words of encouragement to you/us.
 - b. List some of Jesus' words of confrontation to you/us.
 - c. Are there particular words you need to hear? (It might be the words you have been resisting.)
