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## The Best Kind of Glory

John 12:12-43

We continue our series entitled "We Have Seen His Glory," words about Christ found in John 1:14.

Review: words for glory include *light* (*luminescence*), *fame*, *weightiness*, and *praise*.

### The best kind of glory is the kind that is truly praiseworthy.

• That is what Holy Week is all about

### Jesus' glory is...

- (1) ...underestimated. (John 12:12-19)
  - It's Palm Sunday! Clearly Jesus was glorified on this day, right? But see 12:16.
- (2) ...global. (John 12:20-26)
  - Greeks seek Jesus: this is a sign that the hour of glory has come! (12:23)
  - But why? How? (12:24-25)
    - Jesus' life wisdom is true for us, too. Want to live a fruitful life? See the startling advice in 12:25.

#### (3) ...hard-earned. (John 12:27-36)

- It's crucifixion that will glorify Jesus and draw the nations (12:32-33)
  - o But crucifixion was designed to be *ing*lorious.

#### (4) ...God-centered. (John 12:36-43)

• Isaiah saw His glory centuries in advance (12:41)

- True glory comes from God (12:43). His value system. He is true, right, good, and beautiful.
  - Meanwhile, unbelief arises from God's fitting judgment upon those seeking the wrong glory (12:43)

# Questions for further study and application

- 1. Read John 12:12-43. Note all the usages of the word "glory" or "glorify."
- 2. Jesus enters Jerusalem triumphantly—but on a young donkey. Why is this a reason to rejoice and "fear not"? (12:14-15)
- 3. Soon after Jesus is troubled. Why? (12:27-23)
  - Jesus' glorious calling was to be praised on Palm Sunday and executed on Good Friday. What does this tell you about glory?
- 4. Jesus challenged us to live like Him in 12:24-25. Meditate on this. How can you apply this today?
