Righteousness from God Romans 3

"This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe." Romans 3:22a

Read Romans 3:1–8.

- 1. In this passage, Paul is engaged in a debate. What are the arguments raised, and what is Paul's response to each of them?
 - a. vv.1–2
 - b. vv. 3-4 (compare Deut. 32:4; 2 Tim. 2:13)
 - c. vv. 5–6
 - d. vv. 7-8
- 2. Have you ever been tempted to "do evil that good may result" (v. 8)? What does this passage say about the rationalization that the end justifies the means?

Read Romans 3:9–20.

- 3. What is the underlying sin, with which Paul opens (vv. 10–12a) and closes (v. 18) his list? (Mk. 12:28–30)
- 4. List the phrases in verses 10–18 that show the ways in which we have sinned.
 - a. What do these phrases emphasize about human sin?
 - b. How do the charges in verses 10–18 fit you? How do you respond?
 - c. In what ways does our culture reflect the truth of these charges? How should we respond?
- 5. What is the law unable to do? (v. 20)

What does the law do?

Read Romans 3:21–26.

- 6. Look at the following passages from "the Law and the Prophets" (that is, the Old Testament). What does each one prophesy about the new righteousness from God?
 - a. Gen. 15:6
 - b. ls. 53:4–6, 9–11

- 7. Paul takes great care in explaining this new righteousness.
 - a. Who is the source of this new righteousness? (vv. 21, 22, 25a)
 - b. How was it accomplished? (vv. 24–25)
 - c. How is it received? (v. 22)
- 8. In your own words, what does "righteousness" mean here, and what does it mean to be "justified"? (
 Deut. 6:25; Gal. 3:10–14)
- 9. Proverbs 17:15 states, "Acquitting the guilty and condemning the innocent- the Lord detests them both." In Romans, Paul has demonstrated at length that all people are sinful and deserving of judgment (1:18—3:20). Explain how God is able to be both "just and the one who justifies" (v. 26).
- 10. What does it mean that Christ was presented as a "sacrifice of atonement" (v. 25)? (Lev. 16:11; Heb. 10:10)

Read Romans 3:27–31.

- 11. How does Paul summarize how we are saved? (vv. 27-28)
- 12. What are you tempted to boast about, either aloud or in your heart? Why are we left with nothing to boast about?
- 13. Using truths from this chapter, how might you answer someone who thinks she's been pretty good compared to lots of other people, and so God should let her into heaven?
- 14. How might you use truths in this chapter to answer someone who thinks she's a horrible person who's totally messed up her life and the lives of others, and so God would never let her anywhere near heaven?
