## Israel Will Be Saved Romans 11:25–36

Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God...." Romans11:33

## Read Romans 11:25–36.

- 1. In the Bible, a "mystery" is a part of God's plan formerly hidden, now revealed. What is the mystery that Paul here announces? (v. 25)
- 2. What does Paul mean by saying that Israel has "experienced a hardening"? (vv. 7–10)
- 3. How did the "hardening" of Israel work to the benefit of the Gentiles? (v. 25b) ( Acts 13:46; 18:5–6)
- 4. What is the qualification for how long the hardening will last? (v. 25)

# Read Romans 11:26–29.

- 5. What is the future of Israel? (v. 26a)
- 6. There are three main interpretations as to the meaning of "all Israel" in verse 26:<sup>1</sup>
  - 1. the total number of elect Jews of every generation
  - 2. the total number of the elect, both Jews and Gentiles
  - 3. the great majority of Jews of the final generation
  - a. How will all of this come about? (vv. 26b, 27) (🕮 Is. 59:20-21; 27:9; Jer. 31:33-34)
  - b. How is anyone saved?
- 7. The future favor of God on Israel is assured. What is the "election and "call" Paul is referring to? (vv. 28-29)

### Read Romans 11:26-32.

- 8. When any person is saved, what is the initiating cause? (vv. 5, 6, 30)
- Describe God's amazing, boast-busting plan of salvation in:
  a. the reciprocal role of Jew and Gentile. (vv. 11, 25, 28)
  - b. the relationship of man's disobedience and God's mercy. (vv. 30, 31)
- 10. What do you think it means that "God has bound all men over to disobedience" (v. 32)?

Does it mean he caused our disobedience? (Rom. 1:21, 24, 26, 28)

### Read Romans 11:33–36.

11. What is it about God's plan that Paul praises and is amazed by? (v. 33)

- 12. How do the rhetorical questions in verses 34 and 35 describe (and inspire awe) in God?
- 13. Why are verses 33–36 an appropriate capping to chapters 9:1—11:32?
- 14. Write your own personal "doxology" (praise to God) for the work of God that he has done in your life.
