Read Joshua 4:1-24.

- 1. In the ancient Near East, setting up stones as memorials or markers was a common practice. At the beginning of this chapter God tells the Israelites to erect a memorial (w. 1-9).
 - a. Why was it important that one man from each of the twelve tribes was asked to bring out a stone?
 - b. Where do the stones for the memorial come from? (vv. 3, 9) (Why not just take them from the edge of the river?)
